3.3 - INSTRUMENTATION:-

There are three types of instruments are used by the researcher.

(i). Environmental Awareness:-

Multiple choice test item were formulated by the researcher with the help of his supervisor, based on basic Environmental concepts, issues and problem commonly cited the mass media and general propaganda. A review of other relevant tests that have been constructed by other researcher were also made and relevant item that could be borrowed cited. The test was administered and try out on 25, students of B.Ed

one year of Regional College of Education, Bhopal. In out of 60, items after itm analysis and a through examination and discussion, the final test consist of 50 items. Some test item were refined and other rejected, the reliability of this test is 0.66.

Each item had four alternative out of only one was correct. A score of one was assigned for each correct responses thus the maximum possible marks was,

(ii) ROLE IMAGINATION:-

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This questionnaire of Role Imagination. was developed by researcher with the help of his supervisor. This test consists of 13 items, and have given three statement of students. Its scored by Fluency, Flexibility and Relevency.

So, the maximum score of this questionnaire will be, '91'.

This questionnaire consists of the role of the Society and our country, which is called the main character of the society. Its to be answered only by environmental point of view.

(1) FLUENCY-

Fluency will be measured as follows:-

- (i) More than one statements but not more than 2 statements it is marked= 2
- (ii) One statement but not more than 1 statement marked= 1
- (iii) If all three statements in given by the subject marked = 3

(2) Flexibility:-

Flexibility will be measured under this scale -

1 = marks for same statements.

2 = marks for two different statements and

3 = marks for all different statements

(3) Relevency -

Relevency will be measured under this scale

- (i) If all statments Relevent or true maked = 1
- (ii) If it is not true or have not sense marked = 0

(iii). SOCIO- ECONOMIC STATUS:-

The questionnaire of socio-economic status is used both, School for rural and college for urban students. This test was developed by 'Dr.S.P.Kulshrestha'

In socio-economic status scale the five main aspects is taken by the researcher which is economic, parental education, parental occupation, social aspects and size of the family. These aspects based on some sale made by the researcher to showing the impact of socio-economic status in Environmental awareness and Role Imagination of School and College students.

In this study socio-economic status scale is not scored by the scoring key. So, there has no score in this test. Here all five aspects of SES only to be disscussed.

- (a) ECONOMIC ASPECTS: The scale of economic aspects is made by the researcher as follows:-
- (i) Upper class family:- If income of the family within 3000-5000 Rs. per month,
- (ii) Middle class family; If income of the family within 2000-3000 Rs. per month.
- (iii) Lower class family: If income of the family within 1000 Rs. or lessthan.
- (b) PARENTAL EDUCATION :- The scall of parental education as follows:-
- (i) Upper Class Family :-post Graduate
- (ii) Middle Class Family :- Graduate

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- (iii) Lower Class Family :- under Graduate
- (c) PARENTAL OCCUPATION :- The scale of parental occupation as follows:-

- (i) Upper class family: service man (Included Ist, II and III class)
- (ii) Middle Class Family :- Business man , Agriculturist,
- (iii)Lower Class Family :- labourship, Peon and
 others.
- (d) SOCIAL ASPECTS:- The scale of social aspects as follows:-
- (i) Upper Class Family: Who is participating every time in the social Activitis and called every social meetings.
- (ii) Middle Class Family: Who does not participate in social activities,
- (iii)Lower Class Family :- Who has not interest in this type of activities.
- (e SIZE OF THE FAMILY:- The scale of size of the family as follows:
- (i) Upper class Family: Who has only two or three members in the Family.
- (ii) Middle class Family:- Who has more than 3, but not more than five members.
- (iii Lower class Family: who has more than five members of the Family

3.4 DATA COLLECTION:-

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The data would be collected through applying a questionnaire. The concerned school will be visited for two consequtive day's befor the actual collection of the data. the purpose of the collection will be acquainted with the school administration, teachers and establish as the number of students in each stream will also be noted.

The situation under which the data would be collected. Included things, like lack of facilities for example, desks and blackboards in such situation whereover it possible to arrangement will be made to shift the students to better classrooms. Then first test which will be Environmental awareness test (EAW), it contains 4, multiple choice items which covers the fields of Environment like, air pollution, Water pollution, noise pollution, energy sources and use, forest conservation etc.

Soon aftter Role Imagination test will be administered by the researcher with one local friend. And after this test, socio-economic test will be given by the researcher to each students for filling it up from home and it will be collected day after.

Before Administration of each test students were motivated and psychologically prepared by the researcher to do this almost to sincerely respond to the test item and to leave none. Unresponded to as

this would cause problem. In the scoring, students were assumed that the test were not a measure of their Intelligence and that the whole process had nothing to do with their school Achievement.

The Instruction to each test were given on test sheet but they were further reinforced by having them read out to the students before they were told to start answering. An example of each section was also illustrated on the black board to make sure students understood what they had to do, and lastly the subject were informed that the test was time free. At, the end of each test the researcher expressed gratitude to the students for their co-operation.

And the same procedure is applied for collecting the data for Boy's and Girl's in the college.

The selecttion was done in such a manner that there was a probability of inclusion of each item. If our universe in the sample was equal; the selection was entirely objective. The data collected for the study were fromone secondary school of co-education and two colleges both Boy's and Girl's Indicated below:-
