3.2 Sample of the Study


Most of the educational phenomenon consists of a large number of units. It would be impracticable or not possible to consider each unit of the population in the research study. To solve this kind of problem, researchers select the representation proportion of the population in the form of sample.

3.2.1Sampling Techniques:

There are many sampling techniques in educational research. The nature of the problem and purpose of the study, an appropriate sampling technique needs to be employed. Keeping this vital aspects-nature of the problem and purpose of the studyof the selection of sampling techniques, present researcher employed the stratified random sampling for sample selection. The sample of the study is V standard students of selected schools of Bhopal city. To select the sample, at the first stage, researcher fixed the strata to be represented in the sample. The strata that is considered for the sample is medium of instruction of the school. Having fixed the strata, the researcher selected the schools and student sample randomly.

3.3Methodology

3.4Tool of the Data Collection

3.4.1 Research Tool

Researcher herself developed a simple tool for the collection of data needed for the study. This tool consists of three basic components of the sampled students and their parents. They are:

- a. the general profile of student like name, gender, locality etc.,
- b. Socio Economic background of the parents like caste education, occupation, and income and
- c. School profile like management, school locality, fee structure and the baggage carried by the students.

3.4.2 Data Collection Procedure

Researcher herself visited schools selected for the data collection. After having the secured the permission of the school authorities the researcher collected the data on the prescribed tool from 5th class students. Copies of tool distributed to students and instructions were given accordingly and general rapport established by the researcher with students. Students are asked to fill all the information correctly and can take tool home for parental information too. Students are assured that their information will remain confidential. Researcher after a day collected the filled in tool from the school.
